A brief background on Disaster Management Initiatives and Convergence Society (DMICS) and World Congress on Disaster Management (WCDM): Disaster Management Initiatives and Convergence Society (DMICS), is a civil society initiative that was established in the year 2005 in the aftermath of the Indian Ocean Tsunami, to enhance understanding and awareness among the people about the risks of various types and dimensions of disasters. Therefore, DMICS right from its inception has been relentlessly and consistently advocating the necessity of awakening the conscience of all; it imparts and initiates innovative practices, ideas and thoughts through launching new projects, organizing global events on Disaster Management and sharing the best practices that rest on the wellbeing of humanity against natural and manmade disasters.

World Congress on Disaster Management (WCDM) is an initiative of DMICS to bring researchers, policy makers and practitioners from around the world on one platform to discuss various challenging presented on disaster risk management, and in the past years with collaborations from like-minded institutions and various stakeholders of the disaster risk reduction and climate community in India and abroad, the institute has successfully organised five internationally recognized World Congress, with greater impact and significance each year.

For the last fifteen years, World Congress on Disaster Management (WCDM) has emerged as one of the largest and pioneering conference leaders on Disaster Management outside the UN system in the global scenario. The previous editions of WCDMs were jointly organised by the state governments, UNDRR, NDMA, NIDM, IITs, DRDO, ICMR, GSI, UNICEF, U.S.CDC and various other national, international, and civil society NGOs. These were held in Hyderabad in the year 2008, Visakhapatnam twice (2015 and 2017), in Mumbai 2019 and recently in New Delhi, November 2021. These world conferences were inaugurated by distinguished personalities like Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam, former President of India, Dr. Y. S. Rajashekar Reddy, the then Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, Vice President of India, Shri N. Chandrababu Naidu, the then Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh. The fourth WCDM was inaugurated by Shri Devendra Fednavis, the then Chief Minister of Maharashtra at IIT Mumbai in 2019. The recent fifth WCDM was inaugurated by Shri Rajnath Singh, the Union Defence Minister of India at IIT Delhi in November 2021 and the Guest of honour was Ms. Mami Mizutori, Special Representative of the UN Secretary-General for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR).

World Congress on Disaster Management- Disaster Risk Reduction (WCDM-DRR) Awards 2021: World Congress on Disaster Management (WCDM) has pledged to honour the stakeholders who have contributed immensely in various facets of the Disaster Management Cycle. The congress envisages recognising champions in DISASTER RISK REDUCTION (DRR) for rendering their selfless service and bringing innovation in managing the natural and man-made disasters including pandemics and biological disasters and in mitigating their impact on the society.

CONCEPT

The varying degree of geological, hydrometeorological and biological disaster events across the Globe has been increasing at an alarming rate. It is attributed to tampering with the geophysical nature, change in the environmental conditions and result of over-exploitation of economic resources besides urban suburbs in and around the vulnerable settings of the emerging urban centre. Further, in the last two years, the entire world has come to a standstill and subjected to several lockdowns due to the global pandemic. It is now time to acknowledge the importance of those engaged in the field of Disaster management and give them due appreciation and recognition to motivate and encourage them further to improve their skills and bring more innovations in all the facets of DM cycle to bring succour to mankind at large. WCDM has commissioned a special jury to identify through a rigorous process of screening nominees who have been rendering yeomen service to humanity facing the rigour and ominous impact of disasters.

AWARD CEREMONY:

The award ceremony was solemnized on 22nd June 2022, India International Centre (IIC), New Delhi in the presence of a large gathering of national dignitaries. The Hon'ble Union Minister of Tourism, Culture and Development of North Eastern Region, Government of India, Shri G Kishan Reddy was the Chief Guest. The Convenor and President of WCDM- DMICS, Dr. Ananda Babu presided over the award ceremony. Guests of Honour were Mr. Justice M.M. Kumar, Former Chief Justice of Jammu and Kashmir High Court, Former Judge of the Punjab and Haryana High Court at Chandigarh and currently sitting Member of National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) India; Mr. Justice J.R. Midha, Former Judge Delhi High Court; Mr. Sanjay Kumar, IAS, Secretary, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports Government of India and Prof. Nuzhat Parveen Khan, Dean School of law, Bennett University, Times of India Group, Former Dean Faculty of Law, Jamia Millia Islamia.
